INFORMATION UNDER SECTION 4(1)(b) OF THE ACT

4 (1)b

(I) The particulars of its organization, functions and duties:

The Institute of Mathematical Sciences (IMSc), founded by Alladi Ramakrishnan in 1962, is a national institution for fundamental research in the Mathematical and Physical Sciences. The Policy making bodies of the Institute are Governing Board and the Executive Council (Annexure I). Director is the Executive Head of the organisation. The present Director of the institute is Prof. V. Arvind. He is assisted by the faculty members in respect of all Academic matters and by the Registrar in all other Administrative and Financial matters. The Institute has an active graduate research program to which a select group of students are admitted every year to work towards a Ph.D. degree. IMSc hosts a large number of scientists at the post-doctoral level and supports a vibrant Visiting Scientist Scheme. More information is available under Academic Programmes at IMSc.

Details of Infrastructure :

- A centrally air-conditioned houses academic members of **IMSc** with several lecture halls, class rooms & other facilities.
- ♦ A 190 seater Ramanujan auditorium, is used for large scientific meetings while smaller lecture halls and classrooms accommodate more modest gatherings. The Institute is divided into four parts

(a) Institutional : The Institutional part contains Main Building , Library Building , officecum-lecture-hall complex, Tennis Court, Research Scholars Office Annexe.

(b) Residential [On campus-opposite Institute]: The Residential [On campus-opposite Institute] contains New Guest House Building, 6 Guest House blocks with 4 flat lets each viz., (i) Tungabhatra, (ii) Vaigai, (iii) Palaru, (iv) Kaveri, (v) Krishna & (vi) Godavari, Guest House Canteen, Students Hostel with 67 Hostel slots for men and 38 Hostel slots for Women with TV Halls, lift, washing machine zones, Music room, common kitchen, night pantry, Sports Complex with well equipped Gym, Indoor wooden Badminton Court, Table Tennis Court besides a Mini Footbal Ground.

(c) Residential [Off Campus Staff Quarters at Thiruvanmiyur] : IMSc has its own faculty housing in Tiruvanmiyur near the seashore.

<u>At DAE Nodal Centre, Pallavaram – 14 kms away from Campus:</u>

(d) Residential [Off campus - PDF Flatlet block]: 13 flats with TV Hall, lift etc.,

(e) Residential [Off campus – Research Scholar Hostel block]: 31 hostel rooms with attached bath facility & balcony, TV halls, washing machine zone, common kitchen canteen with kitchen & dining halls at DAE Nodal Centre, Pallavaram – 14 Kms away from Campus].

• Most public areas in the Institute, including seminar and discussion rooms, lounges and the auditorium are Wi-Fi enabled.

Research at **IMSc** is supported by the <u>Department of Atomic Energy</u> of the Government of India and by the <u>Government of Tamil Nadu</u>. Institute members work primarily in the areas of Mathematics, Theoretical Computer Science and <u>Theoretical Physics</u>.

IMSc has an outstanding scientific <u>library with 32818 sq.ft.</u>, a <u>computing facility</u> which contains the fastest <u>academic computer</u> in India (as of mid 2004) and a dedicated high-speed network. The Institute hosts several national and international scientific <u>meetings</u> every year. The Institute <u>Annual</u> <u>Reports</u> summarize past and ongoing research.

The Director, being the Executive Head of the Institute, will organise the working of the Institute in accordance with the rules, regulations and byelaws and also act under the general directions and control of the Executive Council.
